**I vow to thee, my country,

The love that never falters,  
The love that pays the price,

Her fortress is a faithful heart,  
Her pride is suffering;

**Lord of all hopefulness, Lord of all joy  
Who’s trust, ever childlike, no care could destroy,  
Be there at our waking, and give us, we pray,  
Your bliss in our hearts, Lord at the break of the day**

**Lord of all eagerness, Lord of all faith,  
Whose strong hands were skilled at the plane and the lathe  
Be there at our labours, and give us, we pray,  
Your strength in our hearts, Lord, at the eve of the day.**

**Lord of all kindness, Lord of all grace,  
Your hands swift to welcome, your arms to embrace,  
Be there at our homing, and give us, we pray,  
Your love in our hearts, Lord, at the eve of the day.**

**Lord of all gentleness, Lord of all calm  
Whose voice is contentment, whose presence is balm,  
Be there at our sleeping, and give us, we pray  
Your peace in our hearts, Lord, at the end of the day.**

Let us confess to God the sins and shortcomings of the world; its pride, its selfishness, its greed; its evil divisions and hatreds. Let us confess our share in what is wrong, and our failure to seek and establish that peace which God wills for his children.

**Father, we have sinned against heaven and against you.  
We are not worthy to be called your children.  
we turn to you again. Have mercy on us, bring us back to yourself  
As those who once were dead But now have life through Christ our Lord. Amen**

Almighty God, Who forgives all who truly repent, Who forgives all who truly repent,  
Pardon and deliver you from all your sins, confirm and strengthen you in all goodness,  
And keep you in life eternal; Through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**
