Edwinstowe Village News Summer Edition 2025

Well, what a spring we had this year with all the sunshine. It certainly lifted the spirits after a particularly grey and gloomy winter. Those of you who take your children or dogs to Jubilee Park on Mansfield Road will have seen the Multi Use Games Area (MUGA) has been completed. It is already well used by children wanting to play football or practice their basketball skills. It offers something in addition to the recently upgraded ever popular skate park. As a member of the Parish Council, I know how much councillors are committed to providing outdoor play and sporting facilities to encourage children and young people to engage in healthy outdoor play. Jubilee Park is a wonderful outdoor space and the council are committed to adding additional children's play equipment on the various play parks in the village as funding becomes available.

A word about this magazine: we've been going for 14 years now with three editions per year. Obviously content can't compare with the immediacy of social media but we provide a different service. It's a magazine published by the Parish Council, so inevitably there are some articles keeping residents informed about the work of the council as part of being open and accountable. Importantly, it gives clubs and community groups a chance to promote themselves and their activities. Also, local businesses are able to advertise the services they can offer. So a traditional paper magazine still serves a useful purpose in reflecting all that is positive about our special village and I hope you'll agree, the articles are always positive!

Election result for Nottinghamshire County Council

For those of you who may have missed the result of the election for Nottinghamshire County Council, held on Thursday 1st May, the result and votes cast are listed below. Edwinstowe is one of six villages which make up the Sherwood Forest Division, the others being Clipstone, Kings Clipstone, Rufford, Wellow and Eakring. The Division is represented by one County Councillor. There are 66 County Councillors in all, so at least 34 seats need to be won for party to gain control of the council. The County Council is responsible for many local services such as education and children and young people's services, highways and street lighting, adult social care including services for the elderly and disabled, libraries and country parks.

The result for the Sherwood Forest Division was as follows:

Caroline Ellis	(Labour)	. 595
James Gamble	(Reform UK)	. 1610 * elected
Sheila Greatrex-White	(Green Party)	. 157

Reform UK took 40 seats and therefore have won control of the County Council taking over from the Conservatives who have controlled the council since 2017.

The Annual Parish Meeting

The Annual Parish Meeting was held in the Parish Council room on Wednesday 14th May and was attended by parish councillors and several members of the public. The meeting is a legal requirement where a report of the Council's activities over the previous year is given to the public who have an opportunity to ask questions relating to Council activities and responsibilities.

The Chair of the Parish Council, Councillor Clive Parkin, welcomed members of the public and thanked councillors for their dedication and the considerable time they put in as elected members, who are all volunteers and claim no expenses. He reported that in addition to carrying out all its usual responsibilities in looking after the village and maintaining all the facilities, substantial improvements had been made to the skate park; a multi use games area had been built adjacent to the skate park; new play equipment had been installed on Fourth Avenue play area.

Also, major renovation work was being carried out on the Village Hall which should be completed by the end of June. The council planned to install more play equipment on the Jubilee Park and Henton Road play areas as soon as finances allowed. Councillor Parkin thanked the Parish Clerk, Mrs Alice Dunn, and her team for all their work during the year. The Parish Clerk gave a financial report which indicated the finances were in good order and the Council was on a sound financial footing looking to the future.

The Annual Parish Meeting Continued...

Several members of the public commented or asked questions. These included the need to restore the appearance of the history trail boards, tidying up the nature conservation area near the bridge, communication with the public, the possibility of reopening the public toilets, concern about the management of Sherwood Forest Country Park and lack of communication by RSPB. The Chair thanked the members of the public for their contributions and promised the Council would consider all the points raised and take appropriate action. A meeting with the RSPB was being sought to resolve some of the concerns raised by Edwinstowe residents.

The Annual Parish meeting was followed by the Annual General Meeting of the Parish Council. Councillor Clive Parkin was re-elected Chair of the Parish Council and Councillor John Peck was re-elected as Vice-chair. It was agreed that members would remain on the same committees and working parties which include, finance and general purposes, parks and open spaces, events, cemetery, allotments, human resources.

Which Council is responsible for which service?

It can be confusing for members of the public to find out which council is responsible for which service. Living in a village means there are three councils responsible for all the many public services and facilities available in the village and county. At the moment, if you want to know which council is responsible for what, there is the Edwinstowe Parish Council, Newark and Sherwood District Council and Nottinghamshire County Council. The Parish Council is the lowest tier of local government and is responsible for a limited number of facilities within the parish boundaries. The District Council is the middle tier of local government and carries out a range of services and responsibilities within the wider district (the county is divided into seven districts plus Nottingham City Council). The County Council is the upper-tier authority and has a much wider range of responsibilities than the district councils. Note, it is proposed that within the next two or three years, the district councils will disappear under a major reorganisation of local government, which will mean there will be one authority responsible for all the services currently provided by the district and county councils. Parish Councils will remain.

Whilst residents can always refer to the websites of the three councils to find out about particular services, a brief summary of some of the main responsibilities are listed here:

Parish Council responsibilities include: the Village Hall, Boy Lane and Ollerton Road allotments, the parish cemetery, Jubilee Park, Henton Road and Fourth Avenue play areas, litter picking and litter bin emptying, dog waste bins, maintenance of village facilities, the war memorial, Thoresby Colliery memorial garden, hanging baskets and floral displays, grass cutting of verges and parks, Christmas lights and organising the Christmas event.

Newark and Sherwood District Council responsibilities include: environmental health, council housing, homelessness, leisure centres, planning, public conveniences, refuse and garden waste collection.

Nottinghamshire County Council responsibilities include: Local authority schools including special needs provision, Highways (including on street parking, traffic management, street lighting, road and pavement repairs, adjacent trees and verges), libraries, youth services, country parks, children's social care, adult social care, waste disposal and recycling, trading standards, transport, strategic planning for such things as mineral extraction.

Residents can choose their meals from our varied and tempting menus which are distributed daily to ensure individual choices can be met. All tastes and special dietary requirements are easily catered for. Visitors are welcome to join relatives for a meal or snack.

Bedrooms have been tastefully decorated and Residents may wish to choose their own décor or partially furnish their bedroom with their own belongings. This is both welcomed and encouraged to enhance the informal and home-like atmosphere of the home whilst promoting familiarity and belonging. All bedrooms and en suites are fitted with a call aid system.

The home is equipped with a Fire Alarm System and all staff receive (remove s) regular fire awareness training and fire drills are carried out weekly. "Monitored Dosage System" has been recently employed to safeguard best practice in relation to the storage and administration of medication.

Bridging Borders Through Books: King Edwin Pupils Join UK-Ukraine Reading Partnership.

This term, I was honoured to represent King Edwin Primary School at the launch of a remarkable new initiative: the **UK-Ukraine School Partnerships Programme**, led by the British Council and the National Literacy Trust. Funded by the UK Government as part of the 100-Year Partnership with Ukraine, this project is unlike anything we've been involved in before — and it couldn't have come at a more important time.

The programme brings together UK and Ukrainian schools to share the joy of reading and build mutual understanding through stories from our different cultures. In a world that sometimes feels fractured, this project is a powerful reminder of how literature can unite us — across languages, borders, and life experiences.

The experience began with a two-day workshop in Poland, where I had the privilege of meeting partner teachers from Ukraine. It was a moving and inspiring event. Despite the ongoing conflict in their country, our Ukrainian colleagues were full of warmth,





resilience, and a deep commitment to their pupils. Together, we began planning how our schools could work side-by-side, using reading as a bridge between our classrooms and our communities.

At King Edwin Primary School, this project will open a new window for our pupils – one that lets them see the world beyond classrooms. They will read stories from Ukraine, share their own favourites, and collaborate with children who are living through very different circumstances. In doing so, they'll not only develop their reading skills and vocabulary but also their empathy, cultural awareness, and global citizenship. For our children, the benefits are immense. Reading for pleasure is proven to boost mental wellbeing and academic achievement – but this project goes further. It connects our pupils with a real-world purpose for reading, and a deeper appreciation for the power of stories to heal, connect, and inspire.

We are proud to be part of this ground-breaking initiative. At King Edwin Primary School, we believe every child deserves to feel heard, understood, and connected – and through this partnership, they will.

Edwinstowe Historical Society

The Society is pleased to announce that proposals are in hand for the provision of blue plaques on two buildings in the village, one on the Old Methodist Chapel on High Street and one for Edwinstowe Hall. The current display on the notice board in the Sherwood Forest Art and Craft Centre relates to pageants and events that have taken place in the village. The next display will be devoted to Thoresby Colliery, which closed ten years ago after being operational for one hundred years.

The Society continues to receive enquiries about relatives who once lived in the village. Heartfelt thanks were received from one gentleman in Holland after our researchers furnished details of his great grandfather (born in Galicia in 1904) who lost contact with his family when he came to live in Edwinstowe in the 1940's. These enabled him to inform his grandmother that her father was buried in the Forest cemetery.

Recent talks have referred to Mary Queen of Scots, an ocean liner stewardess who survived the sinking of the Titanic, the Mayflower pilgrims, Richard Bernard who wrote about witches and Thoresby Hall. The programme of talks is available on the Website. www.edwinstowehistory.org.uk. There are no talks during July and August. Meetings are held in the Church Rooms, Mansfield Road, Edwinstowe, NG21 9NJ on the 3rd Wednesday of the month, commencing at 2.00 p.m. and lasting for approximately 2 hours. 
